We have fantastic news in regards to ACHORD's most recent PhD graduate, Dean Eurich. We are very pleased to tell you that Dean won the Governor General's Gold Medal award which was presented to him at the U of A Fall Convocation November 22, 2007. There are only two of these awards given out per university in Canada during convocation. The medals recognize outstanding scholastic achievements for graduate students. Dean has also recently started his position as an Assistant Professor in the School of Public Health. Congratulations Dean, we are proud of you! Continuing with the good news, we recently received the news that my Canada Research Chair Tier II has been renewed for a further 5 years as well.

The group been busy going to various meetings throughout the late summer and fall. As we are nearing the end of the New Emerging Team (NET) grant funding, we were busy this fall preparing an Emerging Team grant, which we submitted to the CIHR Institute of Nutrition, Metabolism and Diabetes in November. This funding would further establish and support the growth of the ACHORD research program.

Greg Hugel went to the Joint Statistical Meetings in Salt Lake City in July. In August, Dean Eurich, Lauren Brown and I attended the ISPE Conference in Quebec City, and Dean Eurich was awarded the Best Methods Abstract by a Student at this meeting. In September Lauren Brown and Stephanie Vermeulen joined me at the European Association for the Study of Diabetes Meeting in Amsterdam, where we presented posters on ADSS data. The entire ACHORD group went to the CDA Annual Meeting in Vancouver October 24-27 where numerous poster and oral presentations were made.

Dissemination activities for the ADSS were also ramping up in the past few months. Stephanie Vermeulen and I travelled to Lethbridge in late August to meet with various audiences in the Chinook Region. We recently received a grant from the Public Health Agency of Canada to support additional dissemination activities around the province. We are planning a trip to the Palliser Region for mid-January with other trips to the other regions in Alberta to follow.
